

2021 COVID-19 Frequently Asked Questions

Piedmont Park Conservancy is committed to offering a summer of engaging, STEAM based programs in a healthy and safe environment. We will be following the guidelines put forth by the City of Atlanta, the State of Georgia, the CDC, the Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning, and the American Camp Association. We will update our protocols with the most up to date information from these entities. Parents will receive the current protocols the week before their child joins us for a summer session.

How will program participants and staff be screened for illness?

Every day staff and program participants will be required to follow the same screening process. Temperature check and a series of screening questions will be completed before anyone is allowed to enter the building. Anyone showing signs of illness or with a temperature over 100°F will not be permitted to join the program.

When will my child wash their hands?

We have allotted extra time in the schedule to prioritize frequent hand washing and hand sanitizing. Staff will have hand sanitizer with them at all times. Program participants will be encouraged to wash their hands or sanitize their hands throughout the day.

How often do you sanitize?

High touch areas, like doorknobs, will be cleaned and sanitized frequently. Each child will have their own set of arts and science tools that will be exclusively for their use through the program session. Bathrooms will be cleaned and sanitized at least twice per day.

Are masks required?

Masks are required for staff and program participants. Program staff will wear masks at all times. Program participants are required to wear masks indoors and when socially distancing is not possible. We will update the mask requirement based on the current recommendations at the time the program starts.

What happens if a child in the program gets sick?

If a child develops symptoms during the day, they will be required to be picked up by parents/caregiver as soon as possible. The child will be separated from other children until their parent or caregiver can pick them up.

What happens if there is a confirmed case in the program?

If there is a confirmed case in the program, the program will be closed and all facilities deep cleaned. All program families will be notified of any confirmed cases as soon as possible.
